Outline:

The current pandemic is changing the way we live and is subsequently having a profound social, economic and environmental impact. An immediate effect is a reduction in global CO2 emissions and improvement of air quality due to the drop in pollution from transport; (which might have some lasting effect, but a rebound is more probable).

This is also our unprecedented opportunity to address climate emergency in recovery plans and re-think our actual 'business as usual operation' to make our economies more sustainable and climate resilient. Governments propose more or less attractive economic packages to minimise economic and social losses, but several question – esp. from municipalities' perspectives - remain unanswered. This panel discussion will focus on the following questions (each panellist to address them in their initial 3-5 min. speech and discussed further in details in panel discussion and Q&A):

- What are the most important topics/priorities of the energy transition to be addressed in Polish municipalities and how are they addressed in times of the COVID19 crisis?
- Which processes/tools should be maintained and which former practices should be changed/discontinued?
- What are the potential benefits from the current situation?
- How to effectively shape the energy transition and climate neutrality narratives and policies in Poland / CEE?
